Message from Town Council

The Town of Hepburn council and staff are pleased to announce that it has received grant funding in the amount of \$2,381,621 to address upgrades to the Heritage Common Community Through the GICB (Green and Inclusive Community Building) Grant Heritage Common will receive the following upgrades as part of this project: Replacement of the roof with the addition of insulation, Replacement of windows with energy star rated units, Replacement of existing light fixtures with LED low energy consumption fixtures, The addition of solar panels to offset the cost of electricity, and The addition of automatic door openers for the main entrance doors for accessibility.

The total project cost is estimated to be \$2,977,026 with the Town's portion being approximately \$595,405.

Our community centre building has a rich history in our municipality. Originally Bethany Bible Institute, our Town had the opportunity to purchase the property in 2021. Bethany was renaming Heritage Common, to pay tribute to the history, and to encompass a place for gathering for all. Prior to the purchase of the facility, our town did not have a large community recreational space. We now have a space with the ability to provide for: gatherings and events of any size, sports, recreation and wellness, much needed childcare services, commerce, education, green space, and a designated emergency shelter for the region.

I would like to thank the Government of Canada, for providing the opportunity to access grants like these that help communities in such meaningful ways. The abovementioned upgrades will increase energy efficiency, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, lower operating costs, address climate resilience and allows all residents of any age or ability to feel included and connected in this space.

Thank you to our C.A.O Amanda Peters, our former Mayor Chris Becker, and the rest of our administrative staff for the time and effort they put into writing this grant.

The success of this grant means that our community and region can continue to enjoy and utilize our multipurpose space in a more environmentally and fiscally responsible way for many years to come!
